Marie Klingberg-Allvin

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Marie Klingberg-Allvin (MKA), is a midwife, and professor in global reproductive health, Dalarna University, Sweden and Guest professor Global Reproductive Health at Department of Women's and Childrens Health, Karolinska Institutet. She has a PhD in international health from Karolinska Institutet and 18 years' experience of working within global Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) in settings challenged by a lack of human resources, long distances to care, and cultural, gender, and socio-economic barriers. More specifically, her research area focuses on safe abortion, post abortion care, contraception, and immigrants' SRH. Parts of her research related to medical abortion and post abortion care has been published in high impact journal and used in the WHO guidelines. MKA scientific activity during 2001-2019 is characterized by a methodological breadth and specialization in the subject of SRH as reflected in the publication list attached. More specifically the research focus on development of safe, effective and accepted methods for induced abortion and task sharing/shifting related to induced abortion, contraceptives and post-abortion care. Current work focuses on continuing building strategic partnerships with local universities and professional organizations in Somali region to begin building an agenda for midwifery research as to strengthening capacity in education and research within SRH. Her ongoing program of research targets maternal morbidity and mortality in the Somali region using maternal near misses and audits in early and late pregnancy and design and testing of midwifery-led models of care to improve maternal and newborn health to reduce the burden of maternal and newborn mortality on individuals. The use of implementation science and a health system approach is focal in all on-going projects.

Seven PhD students have under MKA supervision defended and three plan to defend during 2022. She has currently 61 accepted/published articles within the field of SRH and midwifery while a few are published in high impact journals (The Lancet and The Lancet Global Health). MKA has extensive experience building strategic partnerships with academia and nongovernmental organizations in low-resource settings and working with development cooperation projects as well as building capacity in both education and research. Being a former director of the midwifery program at Dalarna University (DU) she initiated the development of a model for net-based learning in order to rebuild capacity within midwifery training institutions in Somaliland. This model has further been implemented at 38 academic institutions in Bangladesh. She is a member of the International Board of the Swedish Association of Midwives and has five years' experience in academic leadership as pro vice chancellor and acting vice chancellor for DU. Being the Pro-Vice chancellor at Dalarna University (16 000 students and 700 staff) she had responsibility for strategic planning of research and research education as well as development of international partnership within education and research. MKA has been invited as an expert to the international meetings on Strengthening Quality Midwifery Education organized by WHO and has been invited as keynote speaker at national and international conferences on global SRH.
